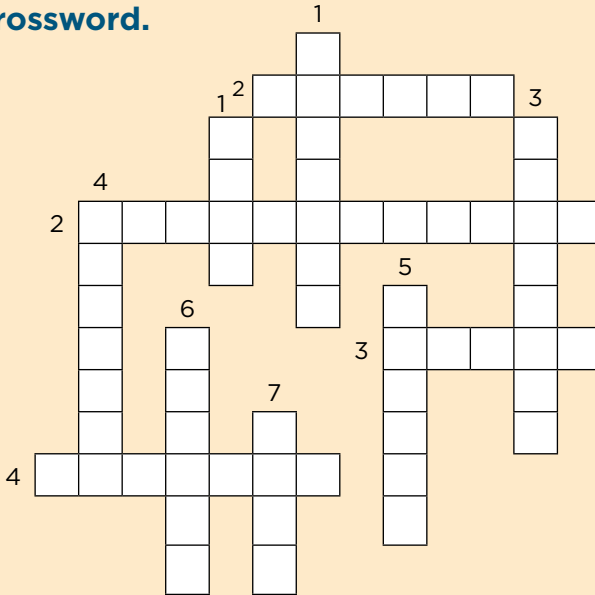

Lobster
